European Humanities University offers the following international joint programs in the 2009/2010 academic year in the School of Graduate Studies.

PUBLIC POLICY

The program collaborates with the Public Administration Department at Leiden University, the Netherlands. It is designed both for recent graduates planning a career in public policy and those working in policy communities. Today's public environment confronts the increasingly complex set of challenges at local, national, regional and international levels. Understanding how to engage in timely reactions, problem identification, and decision-making can improve the public management and welfare.

MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

In cooperation with the renowned Kemmy Business School of the University of Limerick, Ireland, EHU aims to inspire students to think creatively while doing business in a competitive, single European market place. The program offers an innovative approach to business administration in Belarus and in the EU. Its location in a thriving European capital, distinguished faculty, and advanced teaching methods ensure that students will attain the right balance of theory and practice to enable them to pursue a successful business career.

COMPARATIVE HISTORY OF NORTH-EASTERN EUROPE

The program is delivered in cooperation with Södertön College, Sweden, and is unique in the region. Students acquire a thorough knowledge of the geographical, cultural and historical context responsible for the formation of European identities, as well as a comparative understanding of the historical dynamics of European civilization. The program combines professional training in contemporary paradigms with an emphasis on the shared historical and cultural heritage of North-eastern Europe.



CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS AND SUMMER UNIVERSITY 2010

The historical dynamics of North-Eastern Europe form a rich background for students and scholars to investigate and understand social transformation processes. EHU is planning the introduction of non-degree certificate program in full time and distance learning study for those who wish to update their knowledge and skills in the convenience afforded by an EU country with the advantage of learning more about the post-Soviet transition from the perspective of those who lived its realities.
