

Information about the Verification Exam of readiness to study in higher education

Starting from 2022, for admission to the European Humanitarian University should be provided with a document confirming the successful passing of state exams if secondary education ends such and admission to higher education is [possible only with this certificate \(for example, in Russia, Ukraine, other countries\)](#). If there are no evidence of passing state exams, the applicant must pass verification exam of readiness to study in higher education at the university. IMPORTANT! Applicants who graduated from school in the Republic of Belarus do not need to submit this document.

Please see the general provisions of the Verification Exam of readiness to study in higher education below.

The purpose of the examination is to determine the conformity of the results of educational activities of graduates from institutions of general secondary and vocational education with the requirements for applicants for Bachelor's programs at EHU.

The exam includes questions from the following scientific knowledge: Astronomy, Biology, Geography, History, Art History, Literature, Social Studies, Physics, Chemistry.

The exam is conducted in the format of online testing.

Number of questions - 100. Maximum points - 100. Exam duration - 120 minutes.

Question types:

- Multiple choice. The applicant must choose one correct answer to a question from a maximum of 10 possible options. Select multiple correct answers. The applicant chooses several correct options out of a maximum of 10 possible.
- Numerical answer. The applicant enters the answer in the form of a number.
- Short answer. The applicant, as an answer to the question, enters a word or a short phrase "True / False" ("True / False", "True" / "False"). The applicant is offered a choice of only two possible answers: "true" or "false" in response to the wording of the question.
- Questions of open type. Applicants must enter answers to open-ended questions in the text field, which then evaluate by the examination committee. Short answers are allowed no more than 3-5 sentences. All question types, with the exception of the open type, are graded automatically.

The final mark is made up of percentages, the income for the question of each test. Score in percent (share of points from maximum possible).

The exam is considered credited (successfully completed) if there are **50% correct answers**.

Sample questions:

1. Name at least 2 giant planets of the solar system.
2. The cellular structure of all organisms indicates (about):

- unity of the organic world;
 - the same set of organelles in the cell;
 - origin of species by natural selection;
 - ability for unlimited growth.
3. List the capitals of Western Europe (any 5).
 4. Which country became the first center of the industrial revolution?
 - Great Britain;
 - Russia;
 - China;
 - Kingdom of the Two Sicilies.
 5. In what city did Michelangelo, Bramante and Raphael build the Cathedral of St. Peter?
 - Constantinople;
 - Paris;
 - Rome;
 - Florence.
 6. Name, in your opinion, the most significant representative of world literature. Note where his contribution lies. Give a short answer consisting of 3-5 sentences.
 7. Give an example of globalization in the field of culture. Give a short answer consisting of 3-5 sentences.
 8. Which of the four concepts denotes a physical phenomenon?
 - power;
 - friction;
 - force;
 - options 1-3.
 9. Which of the chemical elements is the most common on Earth?
 - hydrogen;
 - oxygen;
 - carbon;
 - uranium.
