### Belarus at a Crossroads (research project)







- 1st part: Online representative panel survey of the Belarusian population aged 16–64 living in places with a population of over 20 000 (Dec 2020)
- 2nd part: same people interviewed (June 2021): Confirmed persistent societal fragmentation a year after the large-scale protests the regime had suppressed.

The protests in Belarus after the 2020 presidential election revealed new forms and alliances to oppose the escalation of violence by state actors. Solidarity and concern for fellow citizens took centre stage, often shaping the forms of protest more than questions of identity and specific political demands. Example: Cooperation with dekoder.org

- dekoder is a German-language online magazine offering media and expertise on Russia and Belarus.
- dekoder combines journalism with research expertise.
- ZOiS cooperation with dekoder has led to a multimedia special on Crimea, content on Belarus, a joint event series focused on Belarus, an FAQ about the war in Ukraine and participation in various online publication formats.





### **Research Communication**

Example: #30PostSovietYears

- Thematic focus together with partner institutions in 2021
- Partners: Körber Foundation, the German Association for East European Studies (DGO), the German Historical Institute Moscow, the Friedrich Ebert Foundation in Russia, and Memorial International
- Activities: events, podcasts, publications, a youth project and a video glossary together with the Federal Agency for Civic Education (bpb) with 15 short clips explaining terms related to the disintegration of the Soviet Union





### Focus on Ukraine (communications)



- In reaction to the war, our communications activities (publications, podcasts, events) were adapted and reconsidered to ensure a strong Ukraine focus.
- An online lecture series was launched.
- Visibility of ZOiS's Ukraine expertise in German and international media
- Official statements were issued condemning Russia's invasion and indicating the termination of our cooperation with Russian state institutions.

## **Supporting Young Researchers**

- Only very few ZOiS staff members have a postdoctoral qualification (*Habilitation*) and are therefore elegible to supervise PhD theses.
