"Belarus in/and Europe" is an annual pre-Christmas event jointly organized by Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung Belarus and the European Humanities University with contributions from many partners. The idea is to provide a platform for opinion leaders, academics and Belarusian students to reflect on the multitude of connections between cultural, social and political Europe and Belarus - a country which is located at the geographical center of the continent but not (yet) a member of the European Union.

The **European Humanities University** is the perfect place to host this unique event: It is the biggest "Belarusian" institution outside of Belarus and yet called "European". As a lighthouse for the freedom of thought and expression it has been a place to turn to for generations of young Belarusians based in Vilnius, a city of great European and also Belarusian history.

This year, "Belarus in/and Europe" will consist of three core parts, the synergy of which will allow participants to explore and express the(ir) European identity of Belarus from the different perspectives:

- Launch of the student creative contest: "What makes me feel European?"
- Podium discussions: "Belarus in/and Europe"
- Advent Market & Reception

Student Creative Contest: "What makes me feel European?"

The exclusive creative contest for belarusian students on the topic "What makes me feel European" aims to explore the nuanced relationship between Belarus and Europe as a concept, shedding light on the unique perspectives that Belarusian youth holds regarding their (country's) European identity.

The main goal of the competition is to demonstrate to the European general public that "Europeanness" is not an idea limited to the countries of the European Union and didn't start with the political integration of the Western part of the continent after WW2. European heritage and culture stretch much further and Belarus has for centuries been an integral part of the "European realm". Millions of Belarusians share "European values" with all of their hearts despite having grown up in an authoritarian system.

Belarusian students are encouraged to express their thoughts and feelings within the following framework of the contest:

The **Advent Market** is aimed to provide Belarusian students, EHU staff, academics and guests with professional, educational and community life exchange with leading NGOs, businesses and embassies from the European Union and Western partners. The main goal of the market is to demonstrate the wide range of opportunities that the European world opens up for Belarusians and to help students understand that there is always a place for them in this world.
